Directions to Emergency Vet: Shephard Avenue South 0.5 miles to Ryan Road. Ryan Road West about 2.3 miles to Lakeshore Veterinary Specialists on the right. Distance is 2.7 miles and 5 minutes away. This is a 24-hour facility.

ATTENTION EXHIBITORS

These tests may be canceled in the event of extreme weather conditions. No refunds and/or fees will be given if the tests cannot be held or completed due to riots, civil disturbances, an act of God, extreme or dangerous weather conditions, public emergency, or any other reason beyond the control of CKC.

Acknowledgment of entries will be made as soon as practical after the closing date with the Judging Program and directions to the test site. Should such acknowledgment not be received by the exhibitor within a reasonable time, please contact the Field (Test) Secretary.

REFUNDS AND FEES: Entry fees shall not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by a Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by

action of the Event Committee. Post-dated and returned checks do not constitute a valid entry fee. The test-giving Club will add a collection fee to the amount of each returned check (\$35). Subsequent returned checks from the same exhibitor may result in their being put on a cash only basis.

Refunds for bitches who come in season after the closing date will have the entry fee less \$5.00 refunded. Notification must be received by the Field (Test) Secretary at least 30 minutes prior to the start of judging for the day and be accompanied by a veterinarian certification if requested by the committee. If in the opinion of the inspection committee, any entrant is found to be lame, unfit to compete or is a female in season and not be allowed to enter, entry fees shall be refunded.

CKC CLUB RULES: No smoking is permitted on the grounds. No gasoline or diesel generators are permitted within 100 feet of any tent/building/fence line in which this event is conducted with the exception of the lure machine.

Please park only on the gravel. WE are prohibited from parking on the grass or concrete areas.

CKC assumes no responsibility for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors, their dogs or property, children or guests.

Neither the event committee nor the trial-giving club will be responsible for the loss or damage to any dog on the trial grounds, whether as a result of an accident or any other cause. It is clearly understood that every dog entered in the trial is in the care, custody and control of its owner or handler during the entire time the dog is on the test premises.

Exhibitors, Owners & Agents assume all responsibility for dogs & equipment on the show site. Exercise your dog(s) only in posted areas and clean up after them! Exhibitors must exercise control over their dogs & children at all times while on the test grounds.

Elimination by dogs on the flag pole or the grass next to the flag pole is prohibited.

Loud/Disruptive Dogs: Dogs that are loud and disruptive may be asked to locate away from the rings/crating area and/or staged away from the other dogs getting ready to compete.

Any dog behaving in a threatening or aggressive manner toward another dog or person may be dismissed from the trial if justification is found to do so by the judge and /or trial committee

Mixed breed dogs that have been listed with AKC Canine Partners may participate provided their listing number has been recorded on the entry form. Breed should be marked as "All American Dog."

ERRORS ON ENTRIES: Owners are responsible for the accuracy of the information required on the entry form. Changes, additions, or corrections to an entry, entry substitutions, or cancellations by the owner must be received in writing (email accepted) by the Field Secretary prior to the closing date of the trial. Other means of notification will not be accepted.

JUDGING: Exhibitors are responsible for being ready at the ring gate for judging. The Judging Program will be sent to exhibitors at least 24 hours prior to test. Judging schedule conflicts should be resolved with the field secretary prior to the start of the event. Neither the Field Secretary nor any other individual is obligated to call or notify exhibitors when they are due in the ring for judging. Judges are not required to wait for any exhibitor. Dogs need be present only for inspection and scheduled judging and will be released if not needed for further judging.

CONDUCT: It is expressly understood that all owners/agents/exhibitors are solely responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any person(s) whose dog

and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the Event Committee, be asked to leave the test site. In such cases no refund of any fees/monies paid will be made.

All owners/agents/exhibitors and other persons attending these trials hereby waive any claim against the club or its agents, for any losses, damages, or injuries affecting self, dogs, children, or personal property.

TEST SITE: All dogs must be held on a leash or confined to a crate except when in the ring for judging. Dogs must be on a leash when being exercised, trained or when warming up. Do not crate within 10 feet of the fence line or test equipment. Dogs must be removed from the test grounds immediately following the end of the test.

CKC reserves the right to remove any dog in distress in a parked vehicle or crate.

Please keep the grounds clean by picking up after yourself and your dog. Dispose of 'poop' bags in the trash containers provided there. Please keep your crating area, the trial site, and motel rooms and grounds clean so we may continue to be welcomed at these facilities.

WARM-UPS and training should be conducted in a sportsman-like manner to your dog, other dogs and competitors.

CONCESSIONS: Fast food restaurants are located near-by or you may bring your own food. There will be complimentary food and beverages for all workers.

VACCINATIONS: Exhibitors should follow their veterinarians' recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations.

What Must A Dog Do to Pass the C.A.T.? The Coursing Ability Test (C.A.T.) is a pass/fail. During a Test the dog runs the course once without any other dogs. Because safety is of the utmost importance, the C.A.T. takes into consideration the individual dog pursuing qualification and therefore has multiple course lengths to accommodate the type and size of the entrant. In either case, dogs will chase a lure made of plastic strips or bags.

Dogs Less Than 12" Tall & "Flat Faced" Dogs. Any entrant that is less than 12" tall at the withers and/or brachycephalic will run a 300-yard course with turns no more acute than 90 degrees. For a 300-yard course, a dog must complete the test in less than 1 1/2 minutes. If your dog will be running the 300-yard course, please check the appropriate box on the entry form.

Dogs 12" or Taller. Any entrant that is 12" or taller at the withers and not brachycephalic shall run a 600-yard course (or as close to 600 yards as possible) with turns no more acute than 90 degrees. For a 600-yard course, a dog must complete the test in less than 2 minutes.

Shorter Distance for Veteran Dogs: Veteran dogs may be allowed to run two-thirds of the normal distance at the handler's discretion. For the purpose of CAT tests, veteran dogs are defined as dogs 7 years of age or older. The handler must declare prior to the start of the dog's run which distance the dog will run. This means that a veteran dog which would normally run the 300-yard course may run 200 yards and a veteran dog which would normally run the 600-yard course may run 400 yards. Time to complete the course remains the same. Veteran dogs completing the shorter course will continue to earn legs toward the current CAT titles. The premium for the event shall state the distance for each course, including that veteran dogs may run two-thirds of the normal course distance at the owner's discretion. (change to section 9)

If there is a question which course a dog should run, the judge will decide. In order to pass, the dog must complete the course with enthusiasm and without interruption within

the maximum amount of time for the course length. The judge keeps the official time and decides the merits of the dog's performance.

C.A.T. Titles: The appropriate titles (from the four titles below) will be awarded to dogs that pass the Coursing Ability Test the required number of times. These are suffix titles that will appear on a dog's pedigree with a higher-level title superseding a lower level title.

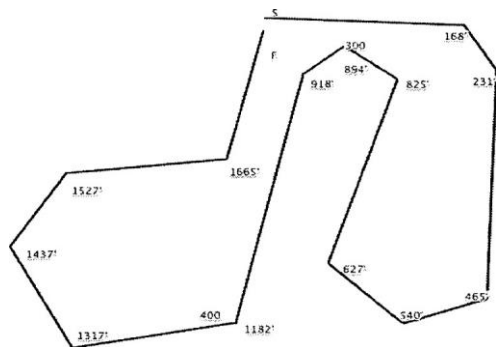
- Coursing Ability (CA) — Awarded to a dog that passes the Coursing Ability Test three times under at least two different judges.
- Coursing Ability Advanced (CAA) - Dog passes the Coursing Ability Test ten times.
- Coursing Ability Excellent (CAX) — Dog passes the Coursing Ability Test 25 times.
- Coursing Ability Excellent 2 (CAX2) — Dog passes the Coursing Ability Test 50 times. A higher numbered title will be awarded for every additional 25 passes.

GENERAL:

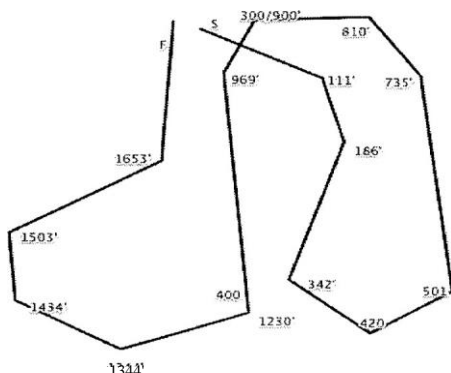
1. All entries must be one year of age or older on the day of the test or trial.
2. Dogs not present by the end of the test will be scratched.
3. Each entry will be examined at inspection. Inspection shall take place prior to any form of wrapping being applied to the dog. In the opinion of the inspection committee, any entry found to be lame, unfit to compete, or a female in season shall not be allowed to enter and entry fees shall be refunded.
4. Dogs will be inspected before each Event.
5. Run order will be based on order set by the field committee. We will separate the running of multiple dogs handled by a single handler. If a dog is late for their run time they will run at the end of the running order.
6. Dogs may wear any collar except a choker collar, a collar with prongs or an electronic training collar. The collar should be snug to minimize the chances of getting hung up on something during the run. Owners should be aware that there is a chance that tags hanging from the collar could become entangled on something during the run. Owners may use clips or rubber bands to hold the dog's hair. The owner assumes responsibility for the safety of the dog with regard to the dog's collar and paraphernalia on the dog.
7. Gas/Electric continuous loop machines will be used. Lure will consist of white plastic bags or plastic strips.
8. The field committee reserves the right to alter the course plan as required by weather and/or field conditions on the day of the trial.
9. The event/field committee reserves the right to bar known aggressive dogs from the event site.
10. The Field Chairman may levy and collect a penalty fee of \$5.00 from the owner or his duly authorized agent of any dog that is loose on the field and not in competition at the time; or for anybody caught not picking up after their dog or leaving garbage on the field.
11. No one will be allowed on the field without the express permission of the field chairman, except the appointed field committee.
12. Anybody exhibiting unsportsmanlike behavior will be excused from the field and may be subject to further disciplinary action.
13. Control of dogs strictly enforced, on leash at all times except when running.
14. Clean up and carry out all trash.
15. Please pick up after your dog and put in receptacles provided at site.
